Item 1 Apologies

Apologies were received from Ward Cllr Richardson and Cllr Montague.

Item 2 Code of Conduct - Register of Councillors' Interest

The Vice Chairman registered an interest relating to Item 8a, Planning Application Ref. 16/04503/FUL as owner of the property, Cllr Andrews will respond to B&NES on behalf of the Parish Council with comments for this application for the same conduct reason.

Cllr Jerrome registered an interest in Item 5f as spouse of Jo Jerrome.

Item 3 Minutes of Previous Meeting

The minutes of the previous meeting were signed by the Chairman, proposed by Cllr Cox, seconded by Cllr Hasell, agreed by all.

Item 4 Public Participation

- a) Ramesh Yadev, Chew Pharmacy, South Parade, Chew Magna, addressed the Council regarding the proposal to install a disabled and pushchair ramp access to the shops and businesses on the High Pavement, South Parade regardless of the non viability notice given that the Post Office cannot be moved to the pharmacy premises.
 - Ward Cllr Richardson has advised in writing that as Ward Councillor the ramp proposal has her wholehearted support. The Chairman thanked Mr Yadev for the valuable service provided by Chew Pharmacy and noted the benefit a new ramp would provide.
- b) Geoff Jones, Streamside, Chew Magna addressed the Council regarding B&NES refusal of their previous application to move the Housing Development Boundary (HDB) to construct two new dwellings in place of existing at their property. Mr & Mrs Jones have been advised by B&NES planners to reapply outside of the HDB, however the property is within the Green Belt and Conservation area and there is a current problem of access to the property which needs to be overcome.

Ward Cllr Richardson has agreed to make a request regarding the proposed new application to the Development Control Committee.

Mr & Mrs Jones seek the support of the Parish Council for their proposal; the Chairman advised that very special circumstances for permission for exemption in the Green Belt should be considered. However, the Parish Council cannot support any application until it has been submitted to B&NES and then

presented to PC for comment and although the PC is supportive in principal of the cause the comments must abide by National Planning Laws.

Item 5 Report back on meetings and progress

- a) Recruitment advertising for position of new Clerk of the Council The Clerk has written a full job description and advertised the post. The Vice Chairman has received one applicant so far, the deadline for applicants is 31st October 2016. Donna McClelland will stand down permanently at the end of November 2016. The Chairman, Vice Chairman and Cllr Easton will conduct interviews for the new Clerk.
- b) Chew Pharmacy disabled access proposal As Item 4a.
- c) Chew Valley Forum on Thursday 29th September 2016. This will take place from 6pm in the Library at the Chew Valley Secondary School Cllr Andrews attended the meeting which addressed;
 - Local Police Matters content with statistiscs for crime rate in the area, however 101 calls are not responding quickly, do not use 999 emergency lines in this instance, hang on for 101 responses.
 - 2. Waste collection changes from Autumn 2017 B&NES will supply all homes with a wheelie bin and black refuse sacks will no longer be collected. A public consultation will be held within the time frame.
 - 3. Mobile Libraries will become Community Libraries with a wider scope of facilities to include wifi and printing access.
- d) CCTV update
 - The Vice Chairman has agreed for the works to be completed on 19th October 2016 and will advise Mr. Pearn, South Parade.
- e) New website update
 Cllr Jerrome will have details for the next meeting.
- f) Proposal that Council nominate Jo Jerrome to be a trustee of the Baber Trust from Rev. Charles Roberts
 Proposed by the Chairman, all in favour.

Item 6 Transportation, Highways and Footpaths

- a) King George V Playing Field new play equipment official opening Cllr Easton and Cllr Matthews were delighted to report that the opening of the new play area on Friday 16th September was very well attended, not only by the school children but their parents who came to pick them up and by younger children contacted through Chew Mums a local social digital network. Ward Cllr Liz Richardson opened the play area brilliantly with a 'run through' instead of just cutting the ribbon helpers cut back the overhanging trees and bushes to reveal and open up the original gates with their heraldic signs. The school are really interested in the woodland area, Cllr Paul Cornelius put up 2 bird boxes he helped the children to make. There is one modification still to be undertaken to help younger children to access the slide.
- b) Belluton Narrows Slope Stabilisation Scheme and road closure The road will be closed until March 2017. B&NES propose to make safe and temporarily reopen over the Christmas period. Cllr Cox advised that correct diversion and weight restriction signage must be applied.
- c) Silver Street The Clerk has been copied in on an email set to B&NES Highways from Steve and Anne Day, Silver Street, Chew Magna regarding speeding in Silver Street and Cllr

Lynne Easton has received complaints from school parents also regarding speed issues. Cllr Cornelius will follow up the proposal with B&NES for 20mph speed signs in Silver Street.

d) Highways – Parking & Painting

Cllr Andrews has previously spoken with Stefan Chiffers, B&NES, regarding repeater speed signs for Silver Street and a roundel by Streamleaze. The Chairman will speak again with Stefan Chiffers to expedite road signs and road marking repainting and liaise with Cllr Andrews for site locations. Cllr Andrews requested that anyone who witnesses a car parked on a pavement or yellow line should politely request the driver to move, notes must not be placed on vehicles.
