Item 1 Apologies

Apologies were received and accepted from Cllr Paul Cornelius.

Item 2 Code of Conduct - Register of Councillors' Interest

None.

Item 3 Minutes of Previous Meeting

Minutes of the 2 March 2021 meeting were agreed to be an accurate record of the meeting, proposed by the Cllr Matthews and seconded by Cllr Leeder, and will be signed by the Chairman at the next in person Parish Council meeting.

Item 4 Public participation - opportunity for members of the public to speak (the public are asked to limit their address to 5 minutes)

A resident requested Council support re No Mow May in suitable areas in the Parish. The Council agreed areas which could be left un-cut as 1) the churchyard - subject to agreement by the Parochial Church Council 2) land adjacent to the Fire Station in Tunbridge Close, 3) play area – Cllr Matthews to liaise with grass contractor 4) grass triangle at school end of Streamside.

Item 5 Report back on meetings and progress

a) Airport

Appeal (18/P/5118/OUT) – Cllr Leeder reported that the inquiry is expected to take place 20th July to 8th October with a total of 9 topics covered – Forecasting, Greenbelt, Noise, Air Quality, Highways, Socio-economic, Planning, Climate Change and third parties not represented by Rule 6 parties (NSC, PCAA, BALPA, BAAN, Bristol XR Elders, JB Pearce Ltd). Suggestions have been asked for places that parishes would like the Inspector to visit. The parish is scheduled for the High Street and a request has been made that they inspect the pinch points at both ends and the middle of the village. Due to the reduced number of flights at present it is suggested that the visits be left until late in the process when some flights might have resumed.

- b) How can the Council support local services and businesses
 The Chairman reported that the former Underwood Lamb office on Harford
 Square will potentially become a Pet Hub.
- c) Streetlight contract

Cllr Andrews reported that Volker have inspected and reported on the 5 lights reported as a priority and repaired where possible, and will attend again to view the lights at Moorledge and outside Debbie Fortune.

d) Village gateways

To be discussed during B&NES Highways Engineer visit to the Parish. Clerk to request visit date.

- e) Parish Liaison meeting
 - Cllr Andrews recommended Councillors view the minutes re the Local Plan and how it will affect villages and the proposal for a street lighting contract.
- f) Rural Landscape Character Assessment
 - The Chairman to circulate a draft comment for Councillors approval for submission by 13 April.
- g) Model Design Code
 - Cllr Andrews and the Vice Chairman to liaise and submit comment.

Item 6 Transportation, Highways and Footpaths

- a) Car Parking Issues South Parade Car Park
 Ward Cllr Warrington to arrange a meeting with B&NES.
- b) Parking issues
 - Cllr Easton has had reports that a resident is placing cones on the parking space (which is believed to be public highway) outside of Magna Minors. Clerk to report to B&NES for investigation.
- c) Footpaths/Rights of Way
 - Cllr Hasell to view footpath at Butham Lane as water has run over the path, increasing the gulley, which is making it almost impossible to use.
- d) Highways sheet letter to B&NES re highways issues The Council viewed and updated the highways sheet.
- e) Speeding issues Newtown B&NES request to fund a traffic count (£125)
- The Council agreed to fund this count Clerk to confirm.
- f) Closure of B3130 Chew Road and High Street, Winford between the hours of 20:00-06:00 commencing on 19 April 2021, expected duration of ten working shifts.
 - The Council noted this closure.

Item 7 Environmental Issues and initiatives

a) Emergency Coordinator Report

Cllr Easton reported the volunteers are still active and supporting families and residents with Covid. The Council agreed for masks, gloves and sanitiser to be distributed where they are needed and to maintain stock levels.

b) Coronavirus

The Chairman to liaise with Ward Cllr Warrington re bringing the social distancing signage used in Bath to the parish. The Clerk reported that the legislation allowing remote council meetings has been refused an extension and currently the last remote meeting, which can be held lawfully, will be on 4 May 2021. The Council voted on a return to in person meetings – 5 for and 5 against. Clerk to register the Council concerns via the link for evidence re remote meetings provided by ALCA.

c) Playground

The Council agreed to invest in two recycling litter bins for the play area and to consider the best arrangement to have these emptied including challenging B&NES that all recycling bins need to belong to a household – Ward Cllr Warrington to query with B&NES. The Council agreed that Cllr Easton obtain a quote to install a tap from Bristol Water.

d) Climate Emergency Report

The Council noted a request from the group calling for all residents and Councillors to complete the recently distributed energy survey, and also noted resident and Councillor concerns regarding this survey and GDPR issues.

e) Defibrillator maintenance

The Council agreed that Cllr Jerrome obtain a quote to replace the backing board on the defibrillator and also to request a full service.

- f) Control of weeds around the Parish
 Cllr Andrews to investigate a report that the setts at the front, but within the
 curtilage of the Old School Room have been sprayed with herbicide. The
 Chairman will bring a maintenance program for the non-use of herbicides to the
 next meeting.
- g) Litter issues in the Parish
 The Council agreed to invest £100 in tabards and litter pickers for new volunteers. The Council agreed that a litter management system Is needed to include involving relevant businesses, encouraging residents and visitors to take litter home, a request to B&NEs for more frequent collection and see item 7 c).
