# MINUTES OF THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING OF CHEW MAGNA PARISH COUNCIL Meeting held in the Old School Room Tuesday 5 October 2021 7.45pm

#### Item 1 Apologies

Apologies were received and accepted from Cllr M-L Hales, Cllr S Jerrome, Cllr L Leeder, Cllr L Easton and Cllr P Cornelius. The Council noted that November would be Cllr Marie-Louise Hale's sixth month of absence and agreed that her non-attendance at meetings is approved for a further six months May 2022. The Council noted Cllr A Matthew's resignation and recognised the skills and hard work that he has brought to the role over his years as a Parish Councillor.

#### Item 2 Code of Conduct - Register of Councillors' Interest

None. The Chairman reminded all councillors of the necessity to disclose all pecuniary and non-pecuniary issues at future meetings.

#### Item 3 Minutes of Previous Meeting

Minutes of the 7 September 2021 meeting were agreed to be an accurate record of the meeting, proposed by the Vice Chairman, seconded by Cllr Hasell and were signed by the Chairman.

# Item 4 Public participation - opportunity for members of the public to speak (the public are asked to limit their address to 5 minutes)

The Council heard concerns from two residents re the impact that any further expansion of the Wellington Gallery would have on inhabitants of neighbouring properties.

The Council agreed that it would monitor the situation to be aware of any future plans.

The Council heard a request from a resident for additional, strategically placed defibrillators in the parish.

The Council agreed to liaise with the resident on this issue and any future proposal to be brought to a future meeting.

#### Item 5 Report back on meetings and progress

#### a) Airport

Cllr Leeder reported (via email) that the PCAA expect to have sufficient funds to cover the cost of the inquiry. Information (published on 2 September) on carbon valuation shows that there has been a significant increase, which will affect forecasting, increasing ticket prices and therefore decreasing demand. The PCAA has put forward very good evidence re the 18/P/5118/OUT appeal. The Government has advised inspectors that they should make the decision rather than reporting to the Secretary of State and it seems likely that there will be a judicial review. The PCAA has submitted responses to the A38 Major Road Network Scheme and to the A38 Major Road Network Scheme.

b) How can the Council support local services and businesses
 The Council noted that Cllr Jerrome is monitoring the litter/vermin issues re commercial waste.

a) Emergency Coordinator Report – Resilience Day
Cllr Easton reported (via email) that Wardens were out in their zones
checking residents' protective flood equipment. They also visited new
residents giving out a welcome letter with information about the Warden
system and links to the Environment Agency and the telemetry devices on
the Brook and River. The Millennium Hall hosted B&NES (drainage/flooding),
Environment Agency, Chew Valley Flood Forum, Bristol and Avon Rivers
Trust. The focus this year was on maintenance and replacement of
equipment, which is now aging. Resilience also means preparing people
across the community to be able to help in case of collapse so the
Community First Responder offered 2 CPR/defibrillator workshops in the
